IDEAL FREIGHT CAR INCREASE 5.182.

The number of ideal freight cars on American and Canadian railroads, as reported in the fortnightly bulletin of the American Railway Association for March 31, was 266,890, an increase of 5.182, as compared with the figure for the same date in 1929. This was due to the number of ideal coal, gondola and hopper cars, reflecting the continued heavy shipment of coal of late, due to the possibility of a strike in the anthracite regions. The number of ideal box cars increased 16,885, and of cars of other classes 2,748. There was a net decrease of 151 in car shortages.

STOCK FOR MORGAN FIRM. WANTS \$12,910,000 ISSUE.

May Be Fiscal Agent for Big New England Railway Company Fertilizer Combination.

Dispatches from Baltimore yesterday stated that it had been decided to call the \$50,000,000 fertilizer combination, which has been under process of formation for several months, the United States Agricultural Corporation instead of the Independent Fertilizer Company, as at first proposed. The corporation, according to dispatches, will begin business owning the Kalkweiser Solfstedt, a German potash producing company, a contract for the entire output of the Tennessee Copper Company's sulphuric acid plant, and distribution contracts with manufacturers of fertilizer for a minimum of 700,000 tons a year.

TO CURTAIL COPPER PRODUCTION. MISSOURI PACIFIC PLAN READY.

The monthly report of the Copper Producers' Association, issued yesterday, showed that the stocks of metal on hand on April 1 were 132,738,962 pounds, as against 128,248 pounds on March 31, 1929. This was considerably less than had generally been looked for, some estimates having placed the increase in surplus stocks for the month as high as 200,000,000 pounds. The production of marketable copper during the month of March, according to the report, was 117,638,681 pounds, a gain of 13,357,884 pounds over February. The consumption for March was 108,650,000 pounds, an increase of 25,538,333 pounds over the preceding month. The excess of production over consumption last month was only 8,985,643 pounds, compared with an excess of 2,945,930 pounds in February and 21,772,739 pounds in January.

A NEW METHOD OF KEEPING POTATOES.

Consul General Richard Guenther, at Frankfurt, reports that a German publication, "The Practical Adviser in Fruit Raising and Gardening," states that a new method for keeping potatoes and preventing sprouting consists in placing them in a box or tub, lined with straw, and covering them with a layer of earth. The straw, which has been published in the method, is the opinion that the improved ventilation by means of coke is not alone responsible for the result, but believes that it is due to the oxidation of the straw, which, when it is in contact with the potatoes, always contains sulphur, and it is very possible that the minute quantities of oxides of carbon which are evolved from the straw, when it is in contact with the air and penetrating among the potatoes, are sufficient to retard sprouting. Potatoes so stored will keep in good condition until the following July.—Consular Report.
