TENTATIVE BUDGETS WOULD IMPROVE STATE APPROPRIATIONS.

Governor Hughes Suggests a Commission to Which Departments Could Submit Early Estimates.

Albany, May 25.—One feature of the statement issued by Governor Hughes explaining his action on the appropriation bills to date has received little general discussion.

There should be provided some permanent method for comparative examination of departmental budgets and proposals for appropriations in advance of the legislative session.

To any person who has watched for any length of time the results of the present system of appropriating state moneys the wisdom of the Governor's recommendation is apparent at a glance.

Commissioner Bingham sent word to Captain Palmer yesterday that the liquor license of Henry Connor, proprietor of the Imperial Music Hall, Bowery and Thompson avenue, has been revoked.

With a silver half dollar in her uplifted right hand, Miss Evangeline Booth, commander of the Salvation Army, announced as her text last night at the opening of the national congress, "In God we trust."

Miss Booth said that for weeks she had called upon God to dominate every meeting of the congress. She told of the wonderful work of the army among the "devil's leavings" and begged all her hearers to keep up good work.

Somebody said to her a few days ago, she said, that the Salvation Army would go to pieces when General Booth died.

"But," she said, with hands upstretched and eyes lifted, "much as I love, adore and respect my father, do you think he is the highest owner of the Salvation Army that I have to hold up to you?"

Commander Booth entered the crowded hall at 8 p. m., preceded by her staff officers and followed by soldiers bearing a large red and blue umbrella with white stripes, and surmounted by a statue of Liberty, bearing a lighted torch.

BANKS BILL VETOED STATE BONDS AFFECTED.

Governor Hughes Approves the Bill to Prevent Forest Fires.

Albany, May 25.—Governor Hughes to-day vetoed the bill of the Assembly Committee on Banks permitting deposits of state moneys to be secured by municipal or corporate bonds legal as savings bank investments.

This measure was urged by bankers on the plea that the surety companies had raised their rates almost to a prohibitive extent, but was opposed bitterly by some legislators because of the effect it would have on the market for state bonds.

It is entirely proper that the state should favor its own bonds in providing security for the deposit of its own moneys. I am advised by the State Controller that the preference given by the statute has materially assisted in the disposition of bonds.

The Governor vetoed Assemblyman Ward's bill amending the religious corporations law relative to the incorporation and government of Holy Orthodox Greek Catholic churches.

The bill also raised the salary of Commissioner Whipple from \$5,000 to \$6,000 a year. The Governor vetoed the bill.

The bill authorizes the Forest, Fish and Game Commission to establish a more complete and systematic system of fire protection.

Commissioner Whipple of the Forest, Fish and Game Department said that the forest preserve would be divided into four fire districts, three in the Adirondacks and one in the Catskills.

The Governor signed Senator Grady's bill providing for additional expense in the office of the Commissioner of Records in New York, at salaries fixed by the commissioner.

The writ of attachment was not prepared until to-day. It was issued by the clerk of the court in the name of the President.

Chattanooga, Tenn., May 25.—The decision of the Supreme Court in the contempt case of ex-Sheriff J. F. Shipp has shocked this city greatly. The aged ex-Sheriff appears stunned, and his friends decline to discuss the case.

SHERIFF UNABLE TO SAVE NEGRO. Unmasked Arkansas Lynchers Batter Down Jail Door with Sledge Hammers.

Pine Bluff, Ark., May 25.—Lovett Davis, charged with an attempted assault on a sixteen-year-old girl here on Friday night, was taken from the jail at midnight by an unmasked mob of three hundred men and hanged to a telephone pole on one of the principal streets.

BILTMORE HUNTING CLUB. Chicago Organization Formed to Take Over Lease of G. W. Vanderbilt's Preserve.
