into a pall over crushed ice and salt. Pile crushed ice and salt all around it and let the cream freeze for about two hours. Just before serving dip the mould into warm water, wipe it off, remove the cover and turn on to an ice cold plate. Serve in dishes which have been in the refrigerator long enough to become thoroughly chilled.

This claret cup, as prepared by a famous foreign chef, is especially suited to mid-summer days. Squeeze the juice of three medium sized, sound lemons into a tall pitcher. Mix the juice with four tablespoonfuls of powdered sugar. Add two pones of red Curaçao, two slices of cucumber rind and a bottle of plain soda. Then pour in three pints of claret. Mix thoroughly with a spoon and add ice weighing about three-quarters of a pound, claret with thin slices of orange that have been cut into tiny squares, berries of any kind and a few sprays of mint. Serve in punch glasses, and it will be not only refreshing to the palate but pretty to look at.

A salad of cherries and walnuts is prepared as follows: Stone a quart of dark red California cherries, fill the cavities with chopped walnuts and place the fruit on white lettuce leaves. Cover all with French dressing to which cherry juice has been added, and sprinkle the top with a few minced sprays of parsley. This is often served with cream cheese and wafers.
