DISCHARGED THEN REARRESTED

Men Released on Charge of Defrauding Government Locked Up on Larceny Charge

Two teamsters, Walter P. Bruce, living at No. 61 West 18th street, and John Miller, who were arrested last July on a charge of attempting to defraud the United States government out of customs duties were discharged yesterday by United States Commissioner Shields. They were immediately re-arrested by Detectives Fitzsimmons and Flood at the District Attorney's office and locked up at the Police Headquarters, charged with the larceny of seven bolts of cloth while in transit from a ship docked in Hoboken to the place of business of Simon Hess, of No. 44 Washington street. The federal officials did not believe they were good case against the men, but Mr. Hess swore out a warrant for their arrest before Magistrate Steiner. It was said yesterday that the question of jurisdiction might be raised, as the alleged theft occurred on a ferryboat.
