CHRISTMAS MAIL FOR EUROPE.

DISMISSES TEAL INDICTMENT.

Judge Foster, in the Court of General Sessions, yesterday morning dismissed the indictment against Mrs. Ben Teal, wife of the theatrical manager, for attempted subornation of perjury. Mrs. Teal was charged with having suborned certain witnesses in the suit of Mrs. Frank J. Gould for absolute divorce. The Court of Appeals recently reversed a conviction of Mrs. Teal on the ground that she should never have been indicted. In the face of this opinion Judge Foster said that he had no choice except to dismiss the indictment.
