PRaises Tariff Law.

Representative Longworth Speaks at Shoe Dinner.

Representative Nicholas Longworth, of Ohio, told three hundred members of the National Boot and Shoe Manufacturers' Association at their sixth annual dinner in the Hotel Astor last night that, discussing the Payne tariff law from the standpoint of one who believes in reasonable protection, he was not satisfied that some of the duties provided in the bill were as low as they could safely have been, yet he would defend his vote for the bill on the ground that the law was far superior to the Dingley law which it replaced.

"I believe that I may fairly call myself a Republican of the progressive type," he declared. "I know that I am as sincere and firm a believer in those policies of progressive Republicanism, which are generally termed the Roosevelt policies, as any man in either house of Congress, whether he voted for or against the Payne law, and I think that I may venture to say also that I know what those policies are as well as any man in either house of Congress."

"If any man," he said, "had confined his Christmas dinner to sweetened biscuits, figs, lemons and pineapples, had washed it down with champagne, ended up with coffee made of chicory root and had topped it off with a glass of brandy and a cigarette, he might have claimed with some show of justice if this savory repast had cost him more this year than it did last, that the Payne law was responsible for the increased price, for these eatables and drinkables are the only ones upon which the duties were increased by the Payne law."
