

IN AWE OF MILITIA PAPER STRIKE-QUIET.

Maine Troops in Readiness to Respond if Needed.

Livermore Falls, Me., March 26.—The announcement that Sheriff Dana O. Coolidge, of Franklin County, had called out Company K, of the state militia, at Farmington, N. H., today, is not effective in exciting a calm over the strike situation at the International Paper Company's mills here, and in Cushman, an adjoining village, that it was believed that the militia would not be needed immediately. Accordingly, Sheriff Coolidge of Franklin County countermanded the company's order to proceed to Cushman, Company K, however, is to remain all night at its armory in readiness to respond to a hurry call.

Except for an encounter early to-day between a group of strikers and a deputy sheriff, in which the officer was knocked down and lost his club, the day passed without disturbance of any kind. Sheriff Coolidge tonight is in Cushman, ready to act if his services are needed. Sheriff Hastings of Androscoggin County, in which Livermore Falls is situated, is also on the ground and in close touch with the situation. Eight more guards went on duty at the paper company's plant here to-day, bringing the total number up to twenty-five.

SYMPATHETIC STRIKE OFF.

Union Labor Will Give Financial Aid to Quaker Carmen.

Philadelphia, March 26.—The sympathetic strike in support of the trolley men, which was in force three weeks, came to an end tonight, and to-morrow the Central Labor Union will direct that all persons who quit work in sympathy with the striking trolley men return to work on Monday morning. At the same time the Central Labor Union will ask all union men to give financial support to the streetcar strikers until their demands are granted by Philadelphia Rapid Transit Company. Each union man will be asked to contribute one day's pay each week.
