If preferred the collar could be of silk or mohair, or of the material braided or embroidered in a simple design. Many girls like pockets, and when these are desired they can be inserted in the fronts. The closing made with a few buttons is a feature of the season, and this coat calls for three. Preferably they should be of generous size.

The quantity of material required for the medium size (ten years) is four and a half yards 27 inches wide, two and a half yards 44 inches wide, or two yards 52 inches wide.
