Big Fair Opens To-morrow in 71st Regiment Armory.

The Actors' Fund Fair, which will be held at the 71st Regiment Armory, will be opened by President Taft at 4 p. m. to-morrow.

The work of transforming the 71st Regiment Armory into the Garden of Versailles was completed yesterday, and all is in readiness for the guests at the booths.

Attractives will become saleswomen, waitresses and auctioneers. The booths taken by the women's clubs will be in charge of the prettiest girls in the city.

The centre of fun will be the Country Grocery Store, where the funniest comedians on the American stage, dressed in overalls and jumpers, will act as clerks, and sell everything from hair tonics to shoes.

A racing wheel will be in charge of Miss Charlotte Walker, assisted by Miss Vaili Valli and twenty-four of the most beautiful women of the stage.

In the art booth will be exhibited an elaborate collection of portraits of American actresses. The actors' society will have charge of the cafe chautauq, the bowling alley, the billiard room, the bar-gain counter and the booth of the Three Arts Club.
