FIRST BALE 1910 COTTON AT \$250.—The first bale of this year's cotton crop arrived here from Texas yesterday. It was sold at auction in front of the New York Cotton Exchange. The bidding started at 20 cents a pound, and after a spirited contest between leading Cotton Exchange houses for the honor of buying the first bale of the 1910 crop the cotton was knocked down to S. M. Weld & Co. for 50 cents a pound.

STOCKS DOWN ON FALSE RUMOR.—Report of J. P. Morgan's illness causes some sharp declines. An unfounded rumor that J. Pierpont Morgan was seriously ill and would have to undergo an operation was circulated in Wall Street shortly after the market opened yesterday.
