



HELD AS JEWEL SWINDLER

Prisoner Admits He Is Man Wanted in Prussia. GOT \$37,000. IT IS SAID Detectives Who Arrested Him Have Recovered About One-Fourth of the Loot.

With the arrest of an alleged swindler in Times Square yesterday afternoon a \$37,000 jewel robbery, at the expense of Otto Koch, a Prussian court jeweller, came to light. The prisoner is Don Cirilo Jose De Elduroy, a Mexican, who claims American citizenship.

On September 12 the police authorities here received a six-page cable message, describing in detail the robbery which had been committed two days before. De Elduroy and his unknown companion had gone to the Hotel Bayerhof, in Munich, and there had become acquainted with an artist, a friend of Otto Koch, who has a shop at Frankfurt-on-Main.

Following the cable dispatch the police here received printed circulars with photographs of the two men. The two German detectives assigned to the case learned that De Elduroy was here, and when they arrested him yesterday he made little resistance.

He refused to give the name of his companion, whom he says he met in New York and then in Paris. The police, however, have this name in their possession. According to De Elduroy they were in Paris when they decided to enter the get-rich-quick business, and went to Germany for this purpose.

The prisoner said he and his friend had left Germany for Mexico, going then to Havana, and landing here about three weeks ago. Asked what name he used on the check, he said his own, and added that the check was worthless. He said that it was the first time he had ever been arrested. He refused to give the name of the hotel he had been staying at since he arrived in New York.

De Elduroy is a man of good appearance, about thirty-five years old, with sharp, clear features and greyish-green eyes. He speaks English brokenly, and can also speak French fairly well. During the entire proceedings he did not appear to be in the least alarmed.

The two detectives who had a number of plush and leather jewel cases, declare that jewels worth about \$100,000 had been recovered in New York City, and his companion brought their loot to this country practically intact.

Some of the wisecracks around Headquarters wondered how it had escaped the eagle-eyed customs inspectors if this was the case. No information was given as to where the detectives found the jewelry, but it is commonly supposed that pawnshops and "fences" had been taking care of a large part of it.




