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A NEW EVENING WRAP AND EVENING GOWN.

Early in the autumn such lavish displays of beaded garnitures were made in some of the shops that many women resolved to have nothing to do with them, although they were sometimes induced to change their minds by seeing some exceptionally artistic examples of this mode of ornamentation.

Now a recognized fashion authority has declared that in the establishment of which he is the head no more beads shall be used, an exception being made, however, in favor of tubes on evening gowns.

The effect of fur, another of the new trimmings, is so different from beads that its vogue may be expected to be of somewhat longer duration. Designers seem as yet to have learned only a small part of what can be done with its shimmer, but more exquisite things in store for the future than have even been dreamed of before.

In the velvet evening wrap illustrated to-day light shades of skunk fur are effectively used in combination with other decorations. There are incrustations of coarse pile, and the bottom is bordered with old fur, which has its irregular upper edge outlined with fur.

The gown is a lovely combination of different shades of yellow and gray. Its foundation is straw colored charmeuse, and the tunic is gray chiffon, embroidered with gold tubes. The fur that borders the tunic is blue fox, which is really gray with a bluish tinge.

A great many indoor gowns even of the more dressy sort are being made with skirts that clear the ground this season. Here is one that combines messaline with chiffon and beaded net and is exceedingly chic.

The skirt shows beaded side portions with a circular flower and panel at the front, and this panel is piped with velvet. The waist is made with a deep shirred girdle and is finished with a little shirred tucker at the neck. It can be made without the tucker and with yoke and long undergarments. Crêpe de chine would make an exceedingly fashionable combination, but this gown could be treated in various ways. Crêpe de chine would be better for skirt and girdle, with marquisette for the full portions of the blouse; or crêpe de chine. If liked the skirt can be made long.
