Metropolitan Amateur Championship Goes to Garden City. Alexander and Pell Beat Gardner and Touchard.

DASHING PLAY ON COURTS

Final Round Reached in Play for the Indoor Lawn Tennis Title.

Stirring matches in doubles brought Frederick B. Alexander, the internationalist, and Theodore Roosevelt Pell into the final round of the national indoor championship lawn tennis tournament...

Before their semi-final Touchard and Gardner had a match in the third round, and in this they defeated Julio M. Steinacher and S. Howard Voshell...

That was their last game as the set. Alexander's splendid drives as he ran up to the net to intercept returns and Pell's spectacular smashing from deep court appealed the pair to score the next five games in regular order without the points in one of the games touching at all.

During this portion of the contest Touchard continually peached upon Gardner's side of the court. It led to unfortunate mix-ups, so that both Alexander and Pell found openings as the champions left wide spaces...

The point score of the set follows: FIRST SET. Alexander and Pell, 4-2; Touchard and Gardner, 2-4.

The champions stiffened their game in the second set. Touchard worked splendidly for the net and reached the height of his game...

By good lucking and taking advantage of every opening for the corner and alleys the champions kept forcing the play. Service counted for little, and all of the four took turns at losing. Alexander in this set proved the weaker, as he twice failed to save several of the games by his flying trips to the net as he drove the ball through the opposing court for the point at terrific speed.

Playing all over the court in splendid fashion, so that his shots frequently earned the applause of the crowd, Alexander carried the game along to a lead of 5-3. It was then that Touchard gave an exhibition of the newly acquired work at about the middle of the set...
