The Ford Motor Company has taken advantage of the decision just reached at the meeting of the Manufacturers' Contest Association with officials of the American Automobile Association to eliminate the weight restriction heretofore provided by the contest rules for stock chassis in the various piston displacement divisions, and has entered Frank Kulkic in the Aurora Cup race for stock chassis of 161 to 230 cubic inches displacement.

The Chicago Motor Club has deposited with the contest board the \$2,500 in cash prizes, which, with the trophies offered of an aggregate value of \$5,750 and the \$5,200 to be given as bonuses by accessory manufacturers, brings the grand total of awards up to \$14,450.

HIGHWAY OFFICIALS TO MEET

Three States Will Be Represented in Springfield Conference.

Undoubtedly the most important conference in the interest of highway improvement that has ever taken place in the East will be held within the next fortnight, when the highway officials of New York, Massachusetts and Connecticut will meet at a tour of inspection over some of the more important roads of their respective States.

The New York delegation will meet at Albany, and from that point the motor tour will be made to Pittsfield, and thence to Springfield, Mass., where the general conference will be held.

While the object of the tour is to discuss available methods for the adoption of uniform plans for highway construction, whereby trunk line routes may be available for motorists travelling through Connecticut, Massachusetts and New York, the conference has also been planned with the object of bringing about a meeting between the highway commissioners and engineers of these States.


Another Extension Added to Famous Long Island Auto Road.




