BANKERS REFUSE AID TO CHINESE REGENCY

Peking Government Fails to Obtain \$3,000,000 Loan, but Has Money in Hand.
RUNS ON NATIVE BANKS
Even Russo-Chinese Bank Hard Hit—Shanghai House Fails—Revolutionists Confident of Ultimate Success.

Peking, Oct. 16.—Simultaneously with the acceptance to-day by Yuan Shi Kai of the post of Viceroy of the Hu-Peh and Hu-Nan provinces, to which territory he is directed to proceed and immediately re-establish the imperial authority, the Chinese government is showing remarkable activity. Army divisions are now being dispatched to the scene of the revolt as hastily as preparations can be made.

The government, however, will have to worry along, for the present at least, without foreign financial assistance. An application for a loan of \$3,000,000 from the four foreign banking groups that negotiated the \$50,000,000 currency reform loan was formally refused to-day.

The government has sufficient ready funds for a brief campaign, but wished to provide against the possibility of prolonged hostilities. Heavy withdrawals from the banks continue to-day. The prices of foodstuffs, too, have risen sharply.

There were riotous scenes in front of several of the banks, the police on duty being forced repeatedly to club back the crowds and protect the bank officials. Government banknotes are no longer passing at par, the best quotation to-day being at a discount of 20 per cent.

Even the foreign banks are not immune from the scene. The Russo-Chinese bank in the Legation quarter was the target for a prolonged run to-day. Foreign banknotes are being refused as currency outside of the Legation quarter. The Chih Tu Pu, the Imperial Board of Finance, came to the relief of the government deposit bank to-day with \$125,000 of gold, and offered \$500,000 more for the relief of the native banks.

Shanghai Bank Fails.
At Shanghai one bank failed to meet the demands. The foreign banks have shipped \$5,000,000 to Hankow to meet the runs on the Chinese banks there. Native banks everywhere are sending their silver to Shanghai.

ITALY'S TRANSPORTS IN COMPLETE ARMY OF OCCUPATION NOW ARRIVED AT TRIPOLI.

MORE EXPULSION DECREES
Turkey Henceforth to Bar Italian Schoolmasters and Professors from Her Dominions.
EIGHTEENTH DAY OF THE WAR.

The Governor of Tripoli prohibited the importation of arms and grain. The last contingent of the Italian army of occupation arrived off Tripoli. An Ottoman decree was issued banishing all Italian professors and schoolmasters from the Turkish dominions.

Rome, Oct. 16.—The government emphatically denies the report, which has been given some currency, that Italy is mobilizing on its Austrian frontier. Reports from Crenela estimate the total number of Turks in that territory as five hundred.

A proclamation issued by the Governor of Tripoli prohibits the importation of arms and grain. The last contingent of the Italian army expedition arrived off Tripoli during last night. The troops were not landed, as their duty will be to provide garrisons along the coast, particularly at Benghazi and Derna.

The aviation corps was landed, and to-day was occupied in constructing sheds for the aeroplanes. When this is finished the machines will be put together and the work of exploring the positions of the Turks will be begun.

Rear Admiral Aubrey has been instructed to have three of the fastest cruisers in the Italian navy prepared for dispatch to the Chinese waters if events show that protection for Italian subjects is required.

Constantinople, Oct. 16.—The government to-day issued a decree of expulsion against all Italian professors and schoolmasters now in Turkey. The permanent closing of Italian scholastic institutions and the expulsion of all Italian newspaper correspondents had been decreed previously.

MOB BURNS CITY HALL

Italian Town Revolts Against Cholera Precautions.
Disease-Stricken Patients Are Passed from Hand to Hand and Kissed by Half-Mad Friends.

Rome, Oct. 16.—Grave disorders occurred to-day at Segni, a town of 7,000 population, thirty miles southeast of Rome and the center of a district in which is Carpineto, the birthplace of Pope Leo XIII. still surrounded by the ruins of towers erected in the Middle Ages for protection against the Saracens.

The rioting, as in Calabria recently, was caused by the action of the municipality in adopting measures to stamp out the cholera, and four suspects were quarantined in a house. The inhabitants believed that the government intended to poison the cholera patients, and a great crowd marched to the City Hall, demanding their release.

The sight of the flames appeared to add to the frenzy of the rioters, and when a woman, seizing the municipal flag from the burning structure, cried: "To the hospital! To the hospital! Death to the doctors!" the suggestion caught the fancy of the crowd, and in another moment the thousands of shrieking and gesticulating men, women and children were bearing down on the hospital. The doors were forced, the attendants were swept aside and the cholera patients lifted from their cots and carried to the street.

Meantime others broke into the house where the suspects were quarantined and took them from the place. Something like a procession was then formed, and the sick were borne in triumph to their homes. Of the nine stricken persons, two were at the point of death, and it was a ghastly exhibition as they were passed from hand to hand, embraced, kissed and fondled by their half-mad friends.

While this was going on some of the local authorities managed to send a message to Rome, and troops were hurriedly dispatched from the capital. The soldiers received order after many of the mob had been placed under arrest.

CHINESE LOAN STORY DENIED
Currency Loan of \$50,000,000 May Be Delayed, Banker Says.
Denial of a cable dispatch from Peking that the Chinese government had made application for a special loan of \$50,000,000 to the four foreign banking groups that negotiated the \$50,000,000 loan for currency reform, but that the loan had been refused, was made yesterday by a banker who took an active part in the loan negotiations with China.

ON THE TRAIL OF DR. SUN

That Dr. Sun Yat Sen, the veteran leader of the Chinese revolutionists, is on the Pacific Ocean on a small vessel, which set sail for San Francisco on Friday last, is the belief of the Chinese Empire Reform Association at No. 5 Mott street. This organization was established in 1905 by Kang Yu Wei, the banished adviser of the late Emperor Kwang-Hsu, who fled from Peking following the coup d'etat of 1911, when the late Empress Dowager Tsi-Hsi deposed Kwang-Hsu.

Kang Yu Wei is an intense monarchist and his organizations all over the world approve of his support of the Manchu dynasty. In this he and his followers have gained the bitter enmity of Dr. Sun Yat Sen and the anti-Manchu party, which believes that nothing less than the driving out of the Manchus from power can save China from partition by the Western powers.

Thus the two organizations, the Chinese Empire Reform Association and the "China for the Chinese Association" on the other, have waged incessant war upon each other in China, and in every country where Chinese congregate. This political war was waged by their respective news organs in every Chinatown the world over.

In the present crisis in China, when Dr. Sun and his party seem to have the upper hand, the Empire Reformers are doing their best to discredit the revolutionists as nothing but a revolt of gamblers, robbers and the discontented soldiery, bribed or intimidated into joining the rebel forces in Hu-Peh.

COMMUNICATIONS INTERRUPTED.
The Commercial Cable Company advised yesterday that telegraphic communication with Hankow was interrupted. Messages are posted from Wu-Hu to Kiu-Kiang, and thence to Hankow, but delivery is not guaranteed. All telegrams must be in plain English.

CANADA PARLIAMENT SUMMONED
Ottawa, Ont., Oct. 16.—Parliament has been summoned for November 23. The session will be devoted to voting funds for government services, and will close before Christmas.

CHINESE IN N. Y. CONFIDENT
Their Fear Is of Finding Their Country at Mercy of a Greedy Europe.
Every patriotic Chinaman in New York—that is, every Chinaman who wants to see his country a republic—wants the coming of Dr. Sun Yat Sen, world president of the Young China Association and champion of salvation from the tyranny of the Manchu government. He may be here in two weeks, but it is quite likely that the quiet physician will slip into this city much sooner than his friends suspect.
