

FOR EASTER VOTES

Opens His Third Term Campaign in Providence by Asking New England's Support.

WELCOMED BY BIG CROWDS

Denies His Party Is a 'One-Man Movement' and Declares Both Old Parties Useless to the People.

Providence, Aug. 16.—With cheering, songs and prayers the third party's national campaign was opened here to-night. Theodore Roosevelt came to Rhode Island, which he described as a hoar-fallen state, to open the campaign, and received a welcome which, as he put it, would have done credit to Kansas.

When Colonel Roosevelt reached Providence at 5 o'clock he found several thousand persons massed at the railroad station and in the street leading to his hotel. The crowd blocked the way and cheered him until he stood up in his automobile and made a speech.

Colonel Roosevelt stood on the stage at Infantery Hall three hours later, laughing and waving his hands at the crowd which was wedged into the big building. For several minutes the people cheered, the band played patriotic airs and the colonel beat time.

Denies 'One Man Party.'

At the outset of his speech Colonel Roosevelt denied that the Progressive party was a one-man movement, saying:

Right at the outset I wish to answer a question that has been put to me two or three times since I reached Rhode Island. It is asked me if this movement is going to go on or if it is just a movement which is connected with me. I want to answer that right now.

This movement is going on just as sure as fate. This is a real movement, springing from the people of the United States. The only part that I have had in it is that perhaps I have brought it on two or three years earlier than it would have come anyhow.

Wants New England Leaders.

Taking up then his prepared plea for New England's support, Colonel Roosevelt said:

I take particular pleasure in making my first speech in New England. Both at New York and in my own state of New York we have suffered from boss politics. I have seen the people of New England, and I have seen the people of my own state, who are suffering from the same disease.

Stand Against Boss.

We Progressives stand against both. We propose to drive them both from power for all time, and to stand for their power for the rest of the lives of the people. We take as our motto Emerson's phrase, 'The best political economy is the care and culture of men.' We are interested in property; we will defend the rights of property; but we put man above that. We do not feel that the rights of humanity ordinarily coincide with the rights of property; but if there is conflict between them then our allegiance is due to human rights.
