De Lloyd Thompson May Try for American Altitude Record July 23.

Fresident Alan R. Hawley of the Aero Club of America is in receipt of a telegram from W. B. Strang, who represents the club in Kansas City, asking for the loan of a barograph capable of registering an alitude of 25,000 feet. The message says that Delloyd Thompson, one of the few "loopers" in America, intends to try for the world's alitude record at Overland Aviation Field July 23.

No instrument in this country will register the height mentioned, and it would take six weeks to obtain the barograph from France, so it is unlikely that Thompson will be able to make the attempt at the time named. He may go out for the American record, however, in an effort to beat the mark of 12,139 feet made by Theodore C. MacCauley. In order to win an official record Thompson would have to ascend to an altitude of 150 metres above the existing record.
