TO ALLOT DATES AT MEETING ON FRIDAY

Plans Also Will Be Made for Sending Team of Easterners to Coast in July.

The list of applications for championship and tournament dates was closed on Friday with Edwin F. Torrey, secretary of the United States National Lawn Tennis Association.

The number is slightly greater than last season, several clubs that have hitherto not held tournaments and a number that have not been active in the competitive field returning to the list.

During the coming week a provisional arrangement of the fixtures will be drafted by Mr. Torrey and other members of the executive committee.

Plans for sending a team of Eastern players to California in July also will be discussed at this meeting.

It is practically determined that the tournaments in this city will open on May 17, with the Bronx championship at the Bedford Park Club and the special invitation meeting for the ranking men at the Sleepy Hollow Country Club.

The two weeks in August directly before the national all comers' championship at the West Side Tennis Club, at Forest Hills, Long Island, also is practically decided upon so as to give all of the leading men plenty of competition on turf courts.

The Meadow Club, at Southampton, Long Island, is down for the week beginning Monday, August 16. The following week a special invitation tournament may be held on the courts of the Casino, at Newport, R. I. Beginning on Monday, August 30, the national championship will begin on the West Side courts, the first one in the month of the game that it has been decided at any other place than Newport.

ERASMUS WINS A POINT TROPHY AT HAMILTON GAMES

Teams from Forty-eight Schools Compete in Annual Fixture.

WHITE VICTOR IN TWO OF THE DASHES

Bloomfield Captures the Albert Mile Relay Race—Kiviat Shows His Speed.

The athletes of Erasmus Hall High School, of Brooklyn, won the point trophy at the annual indoor games of Hamilton Institute yesterday in the 22d Regiment armory, at Broadway and 148th street, with a total of 24 points.

Hundreds of boys from forty-eight private and high schools competed at the meet, and although no P. S. A. L. records were broken the competition was keen in every event. According to Captain P. J. Walsh, of the 22d Regiment, who was one of the judges at the finish, the meet was the best conducted he had ever attended.

The boys of Hamilton Institute scored a signal victory in the half-mile relay race, Davis, Taylor, Picken and Formoso, running in that order, carrying off the honors in the first time of 1:35.

Fordham Prep School finished in second place and St. John's Prep third. Ten school teams took the mark, and the race was thrilling from start to finish. Formoso, the Hamilton anchor man, showed a great burst of speed in the last relay and won handsily.

Maynard White, of Stuyvesant High School, the 100-yard P. S. A. L. champion, flashed across the line first in both the 100 and 300 yard dashes. In the century he beat out Bloss, of the East Orange High School, by a scant yard in 0:10:45, one fifth of a second behind the record, and in the longer distance he was timed in 0:33:55. M. Charles, of Poly Prep, was second, and Formoso, of Hamilton, third.

Eddie Balestier, of Morris High School, romped home in the 600-yard run in the lead by four yards, with Charles second, and Green, of the Boys' High School, third. The time was 1:17:55. Fast for a schoolboy, a new record, as this is the first time the distance has been run indoors at P. S. A. L. games.

The senior high jump was won by Floyd Egan, the champion, with a leap of 5 feet 8 inches. Egan has won this event eighteen consecutive times since he first competed as a novice, two years ago. Banks, of Stuyvesant, was second, with 5 feet 7 inches, and Dicknam, of Dickinson High School, third, at the same height, which he made in the jump-off for third place.

The Morris High School team won the one-mile relay, admitted that only two-thirds of a second behind the championship record set up by Manual Training School, in 1908. The winning team was composed of Schulman, Finley, Rosenberg and Gode. Second, Manual Training, with 1:10:00, and third, Erasmus Hall, with 1:10:30.

Abel R. Kiviat, the national one-mile champion, ran an exhibition mile for the edification of the schoolboys and their friends. Kiviat, without pacemakers to help him along, breezed through the distance in 4:32:45.

The Albert mile relay race was won by the boys of Bloomfield High School, with Erasmus Hall second and Manual Training third. The time was 3:20:00.
