

# Hughes Allows the Superbas One Run

### Braves Have Game Well in Hand When Belated Rally Comes.

## APPLETON RELIEVES SMITH ON MOUND

### "Red" Smith Does Some Heavy Work with the Bat Against Old Team Mates.

Tom Hughes crushed the Brooklyn Superbas at Ebbets Field yesterday afternoon. The Braves won by a score of 4 to 1, and the 6,000 fans who witnessed the struggle are still debating whether or not Hughes just allowed that lonesome tally in the cause of good fellowship. It might have been that Tom was just a little ironic in his charity, for once or twice he frowned upon the efforts of Brooklyn to get a hit when a clean single would have pushed them into the forefront of the fight.

Those in the crowd who were philosophical enough to look beyond the shadow of the defeat found some little consolation. The Braves yesterday looked like a Brooklyn team. There were "Red" Smith and Herbert Moran in the field and Dick Egan and Pat Ragan sitting on the bench.

"Red" Smith was more destructive. He not only inflicted many whops into the game, but he also pitched a couple of nits and runs which counted heavily. His triple in the second inning drove one run home, and he scored a moment later when Maravalle poked out a single. Best nitty in the seventh was also productive, but in the ninth he made the circuit on an error and two infield outs. Likewise he performed nicely in the field, making a couple of catches.

But to return to Tom Hughes. He was at the height of his form, for the day at least, and the Superbas were well-nigh helpless. Three hits—singles were all that fell to the lot of the argumentative O'Mara. One came in the sixth, Joe Schultz banged one into left field in the seventh for base hit. Brooklyn from threatening once or twice before it finally got a run. In the third frame Sherrod Smith drew one of the five passes Hughes tested on O'Mara, got a single to right field, which Smith took third base. There were two out at the time, and although Jake Daubert drove the ball far afield, Sherwood Magee was under it when it dropped.

In the sixth O'Mara singled again and Daubert walked. The stage was all set for a run or two, but Charles Stengel hit into a double play and another chance went aglimmering.

But, even as a long threatening storm comes at last, the Superbas broke into the run column in the ninth. Daubert drew a pass, and Stengel walked. In the eighth inning to make room for a pinch hitter, and Ed Appleton finished the game. An error by Joe Schultz, and two sacrosanct hits in the ninth brought the Braves to score in the final inning. The seven hits that the Braves gathered off Smith were kept well distributed in all except the second and seventh innings.

In the second Magee drove through the left field for a single and took second on Schmidt's sacrifice sacrifice bunt. Smith then drove one along the left field foul lines for three bases, and counted when Maravalle singled to left center. It was only a rare bit of feinting by Wheat that kept this wallow down to one base, for it was billed for the fence. In the third a pass to Moran, Smith's sacrifice bunt and a terrific drive to left field, which Wheat caught with one hand, scored another run.

Scattered through those nine innings were any number of thrilling incidents. Wheat and Hy Meyers made some pretty nifty catches of smashes to the outfield. Joe Schultz, although he made a bad error, had several big plays. He took care of, and he did his work well. Cather, Maravalle and Gowdy performed creditably for the Braves.

## SKEETERS AGAIN DEFEAT ROCHESTER

### Huenck's Wildness Starts Eventual Winners Off with Big Lead.

Huenck's wildness enabled Jersey City to win the second game of the series from Rochester in Jersey City yesterday by a score of 7 to 1.

The game was pitched on the mound for the Skeeters, twirled steady ball to the pinches and received excellent support from his teammates. Huenck presented Jersey City with four tallies in the opening session. He hit two men, issued a pass and made an error, which was followed up by two singles.

Rochester scored its only run in the third inning on three singles and a stolen base. Huenck retired after the third inning and Duchinsky, who replaced him, held the Skeeters safe during the rest of the game.
