

CARRANZA QUERY IS PUZZLING KNOT FOR PAN-AMERICA

State Department Undecided on Reply to Question of Authority.

MAY CALL MEETING OF THE CONFERREES

First Chief to Move His Capital to Mexico City Tomorrow—Stroke for Recognition.

Washington, Aug. 27.—The State Department has not determined whether any reply will be sent to Carranza in answer to his question as to the authority for the Pan-American appeal addressed to the Mexican leaders.

General Scott spent three weeks here trying to find conditions in Villa territory improved. He held one conference with Villa, which was very successful.

Refusal of the Carranza commander, General Obregon, to suspend hostilities pending peace negotiations is given by Villa as a reason for the continued fighting.

WAR TAX BRINGS U. S. \$52,000,000 Revenue from Liquor and Tobacco Decreased \$25,000,000.

MORE CIGARETTES, BUT FEWER CIGARS

Revenue Figures Show Emergency Measure Prevented Slump in Receipts.

Washington, Aug. 27.—The war revenue tax, passed October 22, 1914, brought in \$52,069,126.29 up to June 30, the report of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue shows, and so prevented the receipts of the government from taking a big slump, for revenues from liquors and tobacco fell \$25,906,291.50.

Scott Abandons Effort to Stop Fighting

El Paso, Tex., Aug. 27.—Efforts by the United States, through the mediation of General Hugh L. Scott, chief of staff of the army, to get General Villa to stop the disorders in his territory apparently have been abandoned.

Cigarette Sales Increase.

As attorney and assisting in the preparation of cases against strikers, the Sheriff, members of the grand jury and other public officers, it says, were equally guilty of the crime.

The prosecution and conviction of Mr. Lawson, it says, "under these circumstances and in sentence to life imprisonment at hard labor marked the lowest depths of the prostitution of Colorado's government to the interests of the Rockefeller and Iron Company and its associates. 
