

WHERE VILLA IS FLEEING U. S. TROOPS.
El Paso, Tex., March 18.—Colonel Dodd's flying column is galloping to-night, its course lighted by the brilliant Mexican moonlight, "somewhere south of Colonia Dublin," with the fleeing Villa 100 miles in the lead.

After the junction, it is believed, Dodd's force will endeavor to head off Villa and turn him northward onto the advancing main column. This is the second phase of the American expedition into Mexico.
