

GERMANS HURL FRESH MASSES AGAINST HILL 304

Both Sides Claim Gain in Battle West of Meuse.

NEW FRENCH RIFLE RIVALS MACHINE GUN

Trenches Practically Abandoned for Defence by New Weapons.

London, May 9.—The intensity of the fighting at Hill 304 is undiminished. Both the French and the Germans to-night claim the advantage.

Rivalling even the intensity of the last assault west of the Meuse, when the Germans attacked for more than a hundred hours without cessation.

Three separate assaults were launched last night against the battered but still unbroken lines by which the French held the hill.

Doubt German Claims.

Observers are inclined to be skeptical concerning German possession of the crest of Hill 304.
