

**TO TELL WHO GOT MORGAN SECRETS**

**Seymour's Ex-Employee Promises Court He'll Reveal All He Knows.**

**LENIENCY IN SENTENCE INFORMATION PRICE**

**Swann Gets New Trail of "War Touts" Who Peddled Tips on Banks' Arms Deals.**

Norton R. Sultzer, formerly employed by Seymour & Seymour, of 120 Broadway, promised yesterday to tell District Attorney Swann all he knows of the alleged use by his former employer of information said to have been stolen from J. P. Morgan & Co. It was the use of this alleged parloined information, which dealt with munition contracts Morgan & Co. had made with the Allies, that set William J. Burns spying on Seymour & Seymour.

Sultzer was to have been sentenced yesterday by Justice Benton on a conviction of passing worthless checks. Just before he was called before the justice he made his promise of revelations which the District Attorney's office has been toiling to gain.

"I will postpone your sentence until June 18," Justice Benton told the prisoner. "In the mean time I hope that you will make a complete statement to the authorities in regard to certain matters in which I am informed you have been implicated. If you are frank in your statements regarding your personal knowledge as to these matters, I shall be inclined to deal leniently with you."

"I shall be glad to tell everything I know," said Sultzer, who appeared to be considerably improved in spirits by the promise of the court. Arrangements will be made this week for Sultzer's appearance before District Attorney Swann. He will be accompanied by his counsel.

That the District Attorney is getting close to the trail of the person or persons who, it is believed, peddled Morgan & Co.'s private cablegrams regarding war munitions contracts was indicated yesterday when it became known that another associate of the Seymours, whose name has been prominently mentioned in the John Doe inquiry before Chief Magistrate McAdoo, had eluded the detectives and made his way to a restaurant near the Criminal Courts Building, from which he telephoned to the District Attorney, asking him to meet him in the restaurant. The man told Mr. Swann that he would tell him who was stealing the private information in the Morgan office.

The District Attorney, after he was convinced that the man speaking to him over the wire was actually the person who he believed to know more about the matter than anybody else, informed the man that if he would give the name of the thief in the Morgan office he would give immunity to the informer.

Swann Near to "Higher Ups." "I will give you the name of the man on one other condition," said the man. "That is, if you will promise to give that man immunity."

District Attorney Swann replied emphatically that he would not accept the last condition, as it would necessarily defeat the ends of justice. After a little the man on the wire told Mr. Swann that he could not give him the name of the "man higher up" in the Morgan office, but he could give him the name of a man who could lead him to the "man higher up."

All through the John Doe inquiry John Lindsay, of the law firm of Nicoll, Anable, Lindsay & Fuller, of 61 Broadway, has been present taking notes in the interests of the Morgan firm. Mr. Lindsay told the District Attorney that the only thing that deterred the Morgan firm from bringing criminal action against a certain Wall Street firm for receiving information stolen from the Morgan office is the absence of an important witness necessary to the corroboration of the plot.

**WIRELESS WIRE-TAPPER AT WORK, IS REPORT**

**Swann to Look Into Alleged Teutonic Activities.**

The police are not to be blamed for all the telephone wire-tapping that has gone on in the last few months.

If a report that reached the District Attorney's office yesterday is to be believed, Craig Kennedy has overlooked a bet. The German Secret Service listens in on telephone conversations by means of a wireless wire-tapper, capable of use as far as 500 feet from the telephone and to which brick and stone walls offer no obstacle.

Assistant District Attorney Black heard about the wireless wire-tapper through a man reputed to be high in the German espionage corps. District Attorney Swann, said to have been "impressed" by the revelation, has announced that he will look into it.

Maybe the discovery of the wireless wire-tapper will explain why some individuals whose telephones were tapped mechanically last March insist that their wires are being "supervised" today, though the police vow such is not the case.

**Italian Squirms Through Port Hole to Capture.**

If a moving picture man had been present with his camera at the Italian Line pier yesterday when the Duca degli Abruzzi docked, he would have caught a thrilling bit of action. From an open port in the vessel's hull he would have seen the body of a sixteen-year-old lad worm itself into view. Then he could have ground furiously as the lad, hand over hand and his legs dangling in midair, slowly made his way on an electric light wire from the ship to the pier.

Unfortunately, there were no moving picture men to catch the "act." But there were immigration authorities, who caught the lad as soon as he finished his hazardous journey and landed on the pier. He said that he had stowed away in the steerage of the vessel before she left Naples.

The Duca carried 5 first class passengers, 122 second class and 1,048 steerage.
