

DEMOCRATS BALK, REFUSE TO MAKE M'ADOO LEADER

Wilson Flatly Told His Son-in-Law Can't Be National Chairman.

SO THE SECRETARY IS NOT CANDIDATE

Committee Wants Cummings, but President May Insist on Choice of Lynch.

St. Louis, June 11.—William G. McAdoo will not be the new chairman of the Democratic National Committee, because the leading members of that body sent word to President Wilson that they would not stand for the selection of his son-in-law.

The story of the efforts to make Mr. McAdoo chairman of the national committee is one of the choice pieces of gossip that have filtered through the lobby of the Jefferson Hotel here.

Then the committee got down to work again, when word came from Washington that Mr. McAdoo would be chosen chairman of the national committee to succeed William F. McCombs, who had announced that he would not seek re-election.

Lynch May Be the Choice. No one knows yet who the new chairman will be. The nomination will not be made until the convention is over.

Mr. Lynch is chairman of the executive committee of the National Committee, and has been doing a lot of party work from Washington.

Should Mr. Wilson insist on the selection of Mr. Lynch there may be a fight, but the odds are against it.
