Senate Committee in Favor of Excusing Married Men on Request.

GORE BLOCKS PLAN OF \$30 SALARIES

Says Such a Scheme Would Result in "Capitalization of Patriotism."

Washington, June 24.—No allowance to the families of militiamen, but exemption to heads of dependent families if they ask to be excused from service on the border for that reason, is the Senate Military Committee's substitute to the proposal of the House of Representatives that the government pay each militiaman's family \$50 a month.

PLAN INCREASE IN ARMY BILL

Oregon Company First To Take Federal Oath

Half of Massachusetts Militia Being Sworn In, Remainder to Follow To-day—War Department Anxious for Hay Amendment to Pass.

Washington, June 24.—The steps of the War Department to get ready for possible war continued today. Word came of the mustering into Federal service of an Oregon national guard company—the first unit of the state troops to be enrolled under President Wilson's call last Sunday.

The department was gratified over the fact that it numbered three commissioned officers and 143 men, or within seven men of the full war-time complement.

Much of the detail of the mobilization of the guard was transferred from the War Department by Secretary Baker's order directing that department commanders rush the men to the front as soon as available.
