HUGHES CHEERED AT FIVE MEETINGS

Rebukes Wilson's Attack on All Business Interests

Charles E. Hughes ended a whirlwind tour of Manhattan yesterday afternoon by scoring President Wilson for the latter's attack on Wall Street on Thursday. He had come to the last of five days. He received a five-minute ovation at a meeting at the Hughes Alliance store, 221 Broadway, where about 1,000 persons were crammed for space inside, while some 6,000 or 7,000 swarmed over Park Row and Broadway outside.

"I have always been an enemy of abuse," declared Mr. Hughes. "I came into public life as a determined agent of the people to prevent special privilege at the public expense."

Must Regulate Wisely

"And I propose," Mr. Hughes went on, "that we shall not encourage any special privilege for the few at the expense of the general welfare. But we must use governmental power wisely if we are to preserve prosperity. It is, rather, what seems to be prosperity when the abnormal situation created by the European war comes to an end."

"I do not believe in regarding business men in that way. If you don't want to support me and your convictions lead you to support my opponents, I believe I shall be elected anyway."

Pleased with Enthusiasm

Mr. Hughes was immensely pleased with the responsiveness, the cordiality and the enthusiasm of the crowds which greeted him on his tour about the city. He started at the Young Republican Club, at Broadway and Twenty-second Street, where the police had to escort him down below the street in an elevator to get him before a crowd of 500 people gathered in a sort of showman.

Overrun by Admirers

Mr. Hughes then came on downtown. About 2,000 persons had assembled in the building at 35 Broadway, while a crowd twice that size stood outside. The police had cleared a lane for his exit, but somebody escorted him out a different way, hurting him into the crowd of shouting men and women, all trying to shake his hand. When the Secret Service men finally got Mr. Hughes beside his automobile his hat was dented and his coat half torn off, but he was still smiling and having the time of a boy let out of school.

Throughout the day Mr. Hughes

talked American rights, war prosperity and tariff. In the business sections of the city he warned workers that they should look for breakers when the European war ends and the lower wages of Europe will be in competition with higher wages here unless a protective tariff is put into operation.

Recalls Earlier Conditions

"We are face to face with the facts of business life, and it is perfectly apparent to me, and I believe it must be apparent to you—whether Democrats or Republicans—that we have not to have a change in our policy if we are going to promote the interests of American business in this country. You cannot trust the Democratic party to protect American industry. We have been having the idea too much in this country that we were with us, and nature was with us and everything was with us and all we do was to let any kind of a man, no matter how little he knew, run any department of government."

PARADE FOR WILSON AN ANTI-WAR EXHIBIT

4,000 Democratic Women March Through The Bronx

The Democratic women's parade in The Bronx yesterday afternoon resolved itself into an anti-war exhibit. A graveyard, a field of dying soldiers and a factory closed as a result of war passed through the streets on floats. Mrs. Maud Osberry, as Peace, stood on the first float, attended by four tiny handmaidens.
