


HIS "WIN THE WAR" COUNCIL



Andrew Bonar Law, Unionist; Chancellor of the Exchequer and Government leader in the House of Commons. Has been in Parliament sixteen years.

Arthur Henderson, Labor; Minister without portfolio. Resigned from Asquith Cabinet. Member of Parliament thirteen years.

Mr. Lloyd George, who becomes virtual dictator in England, has named a full Cabinet, but selected four men to act with him as a war council. The council will meet daily.



Lord Curzon, Unionist; President of Council and Government leader in the House of Lords. Former Viceroy of India.



Lord Milner, Unionist; minister without portfolio. Leading advocate of conscription. Had been mentioned as Kitchener's successor.
