

N.Y. May Go \$275,000,000 Over Its Quota

Liberty Bond Buyers Kept Banks Busy Until Last Minute. Estimates of All Boroughs Increase. District to Make Up for Those That Didn't Reach Maximum.

Members of the Liberty Loan Committee here, confident that the New York district has heavily oversubscribed its quota of the new 4 per cent war bonds, turned their attention yesterday to the figures for the other eleven Federal Reserve districts. Word was received from Washington last night at the headquarters of the local committee that additional returns had established the total of subscriptions for the country well over the \$5,000,000,000 maximum, but three or four districts were said to be lagging behind.

The San Francisco, Dallas and Minneapolis districts seemed to have had some trouble in attaining their maximum quotas. Chicago, Kansas City, Cleveland, Atlanta and Richmond appeared to be nearing the top, while the figures for Boston, Philadelphia and St. Louis showed that those cities had contributed all that was expected of them, if not more.

Federal Reserve Bank with cash in their hands or mailed their orders, there were cash sales of \$53,600,000. The number of applications in this class was 3,602. This figure, however, includes the bank applications, which cover many thousands of small orders, so the total number of persons who bought for cash and received promptly delivery of their new 4 per cent bonds cannot be estimated at this time. The total of \$53,600,000 taken in bonds of \$50, \$100, \$500 and \$1,000 Bonds of larger denomination could not be bought over the counter. It was necessary to make application for them.

Additional Subscriptions. On the last day of the campaign J. P. Morgan & Co. turned over to the bond issue division an application for \$25,000,000 worth of the new bonds. Additional subscriptions included in the official total reported yesterday follow:
