Macon, Ga., July 27.—An attack on Colonel Roosevelt is part of the camouflage which William Randolph Hearst has been mailing broadcast throughout this part of the country in an effort to cause Southern folk to overlook, among other things, the fact that the Hearst newspapers continued as champions of Germany even after the United States declared war.

In an editorial "The Macon News" advanced the opinion that Hearst at least might have had the decency to cease mailing out this part of his camouflage during the period following the death of the Colonel's son.
