

Bugler Harry T. Swecker, 317th Infantry, Crab-bottom, Va. Died of wounds received in action.




Private Frank C. Brough, New York. Killed in action.



Corporal James J. Wynns, Co. F, old 69th Regiment, New York City. Killed in action.



Sergeant John H. Martin, Sanitary Train, 8th Division, Camp Fremont, Cal. Died of pneumonia.



Private Budd H. Somers, 326th Machine Gun Battalion, Brooklyn. Killed in action.



Lieutenant Henry H. Russel, Co. E, 7th U. S. Engineers, Washington, Iowa. Killed in action October 14.



Max Webb, Medical Department, Springfield, Ohio. Died at Camp Greene, N. C.



George William Locke, U. S. Armed Guard. Lost when the Florence H. was destroyed by internal explosion of the coast of France on April 17, 1918.



Sergeant Michael Lynch, Co. E, 165th Regiment, New York. Killed in action.



Lieutenant Joseph A. Synnot, Marine Corps Reserve. Killed in action at Chateau Thierry.



Private James W. Cooke, Co. L, 165th Infantry, Ossining. Killed in action July 28, 1918.



Lieutenant Joseph F. Maher, 55th Co., 5th Regiment, U. S. Marine Corps, New York City. Killed in action.




Lieutenant Wilbert White, son of Dr. White, Bible Teachers Training School, New York City. Killed in action Oct. 20.



Lieutenant Clarence W. Appley, Brooklyn. Killed in Flanders while flying with the British.

Private Patrick Grimes, 307th Infantry, New York. Died from wounds received in action.



Lieutenant William A. Bradley, U. S. Marine Corps, New York City. Died from wounds received in action.



Corporal Edward G. Coxe, Co. E, 7th Regiment, later 165th Infantry, New York. Killed at Chateau Thierry.



Israel Stein, Co. H, 307th Infantry, New York City. Killed in action.




George S. Askey, Co. B, 6th Engineers, A. E. F., Bronx, N. Y. Killed in action October 22.
