WASHINGTON, April 24.—The Democratic National Committee will take cognizance of the strong feeling against Postmaster General Burleson and propose his retirement in a set of resolutions to be adopted at the Chicago meeting of the committee early in May, according to reliable reports in Democratic circles here. The resolutions will take the form of a statement to the President, in which it will be made clear that Mr. Burleson is a political liability which cannot be carried by the party in the 1920 campaign, it is said.

PARIS, April 24 (By The Associated Press).—Vittorio Orlando, the Italian Premier, issued a lengthy statement today replying to President Wilson, in which the Premier said in so many words that he was compelled to withdraw from the peace conference after President Wilson's action, which was regarded as a departure from diplomatic custom and left the Italians no other course.

"Betrayed by Allies" Is Charge in Italy

LONDON, April 24 (By The Associated Press).—Public opinion in Italy, according to a wireless message from Rome, is much excited against the peace conference for refusing to recognize the Italian claims. Apparently there is a complete truce in party politics, and the newspapers are unanimous in blaming the Allies. It is declared feeling is running so high that it might have a disastrous influence on Anglo-Italian relations.

Order or No Food, Hoover Warns Berlin

Allied Relief Director Tells Germans Strikes Endanger Continuation of Supplies; Viewed as an Ultimatum

BERLIN, April 24 (By The Associated Press).—A message to Germany by Herbert Hoover, director general of the Inter-Allied relief organization, is published in Berlin. In it Mr. Hoover warns against a continuation of the strikes and disorders, saying they are endangering a continuation of the food supply.

Sonnino and Other Delegates to Remain

Italy to Occupy Treaty Territory

Italian military forces will occupy that part of Dalmatia and other Adriatic territory named in the pact of London with about 100,000 men, it was stated to-day by Captain Pozzi, of Premier Orlando's staff.

COPENHAGEN, April 24 (By The Associated Press).—German counter-proposals to the plan for the league of nations are outlined in a long dispatch from Berlin.


