

30,000 Cheer As Tennessee Leaves Ways

World's Largest Battleship, Sponsored by Southern Governor's Daughter, Is Launched at Navy Yard

"Christened" in Wine Prominent Service Officers, Headed by F. D. Roosevelt, Witness Ceremony

The world's largest battleship, the superdreadnought Tennessee, was launched yesterday morning at the New York Navy Yard, in Brooklyn.

After the launching the guests of honor went to the headquarters of Admiral McDonald where refreshments were served.

Delegations from foreign countries will join with representatives from every section of the United States in discussion of every phase of aviation.

People began arriving at the yard hours before the launching. The 22,500 employees of the yard each received two tickets for guests.

The visitors gathered about the red-painted hull decorated with flags, sought vantage points on the roofs of small buildings, piles of building materials and any other heights.

On the flag-hidden launching platform, alongside the bow of the ship, were the guests of honor.

Weather permitting, a race is planned to New York and return tomorrow. A half dozen entries have already been received.

Naval Tender Sails to Post For Sea Flight

Five Superdreadnoughts to Leave at Once to Take Their Stations Along the Path of Atlantic Fliers

Next Week to See Start Route to Be Announced by Commander Towers Today; NC-4 to Be Tested

The NC-4, last of the United States navy's giant transatlantic seaplanes, was launched at Rockaway yesterday.

Official announcement of the route across the Atlantic will be made today by Commander John H. Towers, officer in charge of the NC Seaplane Division 1.

From the best available information it is understood the three big seaplanes will start on the first leg of the transatlantic flight early next week.

The naval tender Melville, under command of Commander John S. Arvine, sailed yesterday for her station in midocean, where she will act as supply ship to the NC boats and also as mother ship to the destroyers patrolling the mid-Atlantic.

The superdreadnoughts New York, Arkansas, Texas, Utah and Florida will sail today to take up the stations on the Atlantic assigned to the squadron.

Two small flying boats of the M-F type were shipped on the base transport to Newfoundland. They will be used to obtain meteorological data and test air conditions.

Commander John H. Towers took Crow No. 1 for a three-hour test flight in a P-3 flying boat immediately after his arrival from Washington yesterday.

One of the new instruments is a "Turn Indicator" which is said to detect immediately any tendency of the flying craft to get off its course, and to check the deviation in its inescapability.

After the flight was completed Commander Towers issued a statement giving the dimensions and general outlines of the NC flying boats.
