

### Hungarian Red Wants to Go to Peace Parley

**Bolgar, Communist Envoy at Vienna, Says Karolyi Government Is Made Up of Unrepresentative Men**

### Soviet Treasury Depleted

**Asks Only That Allies Find Some Solution for His Unfortunate Country**

VIENNA, May 16 (By The Associated Press).—Bolshevism is waning, the Germans will sign the peace treaty and delegates from the Hungarian communist government should be permitted to go to Paris, Alexis Bolgar, the representative here of the Hungarian communist government, declared among other things in a statement to the correspondent today.

"All we ask," he said, "is for the Allies to find some solution for our unfortunate country. When General Smuts was in Budapest (as representative of the peace conference) we told him we were ready to get out, but we would not be responsible for disorders and bloodshed unless the Allies occupied the city, particularly American or British troops rather than the Rumanians.

"If such a thing as self-government is permitted then the Red Republic represents Hungary. I do not see why the Allies cannot treat with the soviet unofficially, at least, and also consult, perhaps, with former President Karolyi and with men like Apponyi and Andrassy, all of whom took part in the former governments.

"New Rule Self Constituted"

"The Allies should not take seriously the view that the new government is a self-constituted affair and is made up of men unrepresentative of Hungary and also without special prominence or political experience. There are a number of such self-constituted governments for Hungary living in hotels in Vienna.

"Speaking strictly in my official capacity, I ask only that delegates of the soviet in Budapest be requested to come to Paris. It can be said for the soviet that it is doing the best it can and also is keeping order. It is not true that there have been any political executions by us. The only executions have been for crimes like murder or robbery.

"In the light of events it was perhaps unwise for us to nationalize property on so large a scale. We might have gone more slowly, but if reforms like ours are carried out in twenty years' time instead of three months, they are accepted as reasonable by all classes."

Friendly to America

Bolgar like many others connected with the Budapest soviet, is friendly to America, and wishes he were an American. He said he felt that it was in the United States that the most sane solutions of the problems of poverty would be worked out. He expressed the opinion that President Wilson was not being treated fairly by the Allies, nor with proper consideration.

He said he understood it had been suggested in American quarters that all Hungarian parties, including the soviet, send representatives for a meeting in Switzerland to form a new government for Hungary.

Count Julius Karolyi, the head of the new government proclaimed at Arad, Bolgar said, never has been in politics before. Barabash, the Minister of Justice in the Karolyi government, he added, was known as a follower of Count Michael Karolyi, while Barjassi, the Minister of Commerce, is a Social Democrat and former secretary of the chamber of commerce at Arad.

Whatever new government is set up at Budapest, Bolgar continued, will find itself without money. He said the theft in Vienna two weeks ago of the money which he had in his possession had depleted seriously the soviet treasury. This money, according to Bolgar, was not intended for propaganda purposes, but for the purchase of raw materials to keep the Hungarian factories going.

**Peace Is Terrible, but Just, Says Rabbi Wise**

**Militarism, Crushed in Germany, Must Not Rise Elsewhere, He Warns**

The terms by which the Allies intend to end the war were termed "a terrible peace, but a just peace" yesterday by Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, in his sermon before the Free Synagogue in Carnegie Hall.

Dr. Wise spoke on the topic, "Is a Good Peace—Can America Accept It?"

"I judge the peace by the objects of the war," he said. "We have ended the curse of German militarism for all time. We have ended Kaiserism the world over. We have achieved the end that international pacts shall hereafter be observed with honor and we have summoned the violators before the world's tribunal for judgment.

"Having ended German militarism upon us lies the duty to suffer no militarism to arise in Allied lands, including our own. Prussianism is forever destroyed in the land of its origin and must not be revived in any other land, whether it be Japan or Russia, Italy or France, England or America."

**Abyssinian Envoys Present Gown to Mme. Poincaré**

PARIS, May 17 (By The Associated Press).—Two mammoth elephant tusks, a warrior's coat of mail and an Abyssinian gown for Mme. Poincaré were the gifts brought to the Elysee Palace yesterday by the members of the special Abyssinian delegation in Paris when they called upon President Poincaré to offer their congratulations on France's victory.

The delegation was headed by Ded Samateli, Oualde de Gabriel, former chamberlain of the imperial palace, and included Chibachchi, uncle of the Emperor of Abyssinia. All wore elaborate robes and fezes, and attracted much attention while riding through the streets in the carriages supplied by the French government.


