Radicals Failed in Attempts to Rouse Discord in Negroes Chicago Said to Be Head of Propaganda Circle but Leaders of Race Declare Efforts Make No Progress

CHICAGO, Dec. 13.—Radical propaganda among negroes is on the increase in Chicago. But it has not resulted in any definite drift, and in no respect has assumed the proportions of a 'movement.' This is the view of T. Arnold Hill, secretary of the Urban League, the foremost employment and social center of the negro race.
