General Alfred Mordet Is Dead in Washington Famous Soldier Received Many Citations for Valor in the Civil War WASHINGTON, Jan. 20.—Brigadier General Alfred Mordet, U. S. A. (retired), died today at his home here.

Brigadier General Alfred Mordet was born at Philadelphia seventy-nine years ago, the son of Major Alfred Mordet. He was commissioned a second lieutenant of topographical engineers in the Civil War, and was promoted to captain in 1863. He was brevetted a major "for gallant and meritorious services in the siege of Fort Wagner, South Carolina," and in 1865 he was cited "for distinguished services in the field and faithful and meritorious services in the ordnance department during the war" and promoted to lieutenant colonel. After the war he became instructor of ordnance and gunnery at West Point, and from 1887 until 1892 he commanded the New York Arsenal. He was again a brigadier general in January, 1904, and was retired the following June, at his own request, after forty years' service.

EDWARD A. OSBORNE Edward Allen Osborne, thirty-three, boys' secretary of the Y. M. C. A. at Mount Vernon, died suddenly Monday night at his home, 844 South Tenth Avenue, Mount Vernon, of heart disease. During the war Mr. Osborne was physical director at Camp Sherman, Tex. He was one of the promoters of the City Boys' Club, the Recreation Commission and the Boy Scouts organization of Mount Vernon. He began his work with the Y. M. C. A. in 1904 at Orange, N. J., where he was physical director and general secretary. He later was general secretary of the Lakewood (N. J.) Y. M. C. A. He is survived by a widow and two children.

JULIUS SOLOMON Julius Solomon, a widely known retail merchant tailor, died Monday at his home, 88 Hamilton Terrace, in his ninety-third year. He was born in Posen on March 10, 1827, and came to this country seventy-one years ago. He was well known to the South, and during the Civil War he lived at Memphis, Tenn., where he served in a military regiment of the Union Army. He also resided in Michigan for many years. Mr. Solomon was a member of the Free Sons of Israel, the B'nai B'rith, the Odd Fellows and other fraternal organizations. The funeral will be held at 1:30 o'clock this afternoon from his late residence. The Rev. Dr. Ephraim Hirsch, of the New Synagogue, will preside. He is survived by two daughters and two sons.
