

Dr. Nansen May Head Relief of War Prisoners
Explorer Asked to Represent League of Nations in the Repatriation of 200,000 in Siberia
In Captivity Five Years
Plight of Germans, Austrians and Others Desperate; Many Are Starving

council will consider a proposal to appoint Dr. Nansen as a man of international standing to coordinate all efforts toward relief of the war prisoners and to take supreme charge of efforts to get them back to their homes.
 The problem of finding means of transportation, of setting up adequate rest camps and of securing adequate facilities for protecting communities to which the prisoners will be returned from any maladies which the men might be suffering will require a substantial organization.

Spanish Premier Announces Personnel of New Cabinet
 MADRID, May 5.—The new Cabinet

formed by Eduardo Dato to succeed that of Manuel Allende Salazar will be composed, it was announced to-day, as follows:
 Premier and Minister of Marine, Senor Dato; Foreign Affairs, Marquis de Lema; Interior, Francisco Bergamini; Justice, Count de Bugalla; Finance, Lorenzo Dominguez Pascual; War, Visconde d'Eza; Public Works, Emilio Ortuno; Instruction, Luis Espada; Labor, Carlos Canal.
 The Dato Ministry assumed office to-night.
 The Cabinet of Senor Allende Salazar tendered its resignation to the King April 28, but consented to retain office until the formation of a new ministry.

WASHINGTON, May 5 (By The Associated Press).—Dr. Fridtjof Nansen, the Norwegian explorer, probably will head the organization to be set up by the league of nations for the purpose of repatriating 200,000 German, Austrian and other war prisoners still held in Russia. Reports to be submitted to the league council at Rome this month say that unless these men are rescued from their prison camps in Siberia before next winter few are likely to survive. They have been in captivity for five years.
 Dr. Nansen was mentioned during discussions at Paris last year of steps toward sending food and relief to the captives. Word has reached Washington that he already has been asked if he would be willing to serve as the agent of the league in attempting the repatriation. He had considerable experience with food questions during the war, having headed the Norwegian mission sent to the United States in 1917 to negotiate for needed supplies for his own country.
League Pledged to Aid
 The question of aiding the war prisoners in Russia was referred to the league by the supreme economic council last February on the theory that under Article 23 of the league covenant members already had pledged themselves to take interest in the "mitigation of suffering throughout the world."
 While every effort to aid the prisoners has been made by the American and Scandinavian Red Cross organizations, the reports to be laid before the council will show that their plight remains desperate and that an unestimated number already have succumbed to disease or starvation. It was for this reason, and because it was realized, it was said, that only an organized international effort could overcome the difficulties in the way of repatriation that the Supreme Council referred the matter to the league.
