

**Wood Far in Lead in "Literary Digest" Poll**

**Fifth Installment Gives Johnson Second Place, Hoover Third and Lowden Fourth**

General Leonard Wood was first choice in the fifth installment of the nation-wide poll being conducted by "The Literary Digest." The latest poll, representing 1,100,000 votes cast in all sections of the country, gives Wood a commanding lead over his nearest rival, United States Senator Hiram Johnson. Herbert Hoover runs third. Governor Lowden makes fourth place, while Charles E. Hughes is fifth. The vote follows: Wood, 202,039; Johnson, 187,140; Hoover, 169,552; Lowden, 94,825; Hughes, 40,194.

For second choice the vote stood: Wood, 138,180; Johnson, 120,995; Hoover, 85,727; Lowden, 97,691; Hughes, 44,417. Analysis of the total vote shows Wood received 169,010 Republican votes and 17,536 Democratic votes, Johnson received 120,744 Republican votes and 39,206 Democratic votes, Hoover received 74,863 Republican votes and 67,074 Democratic votes, Lowden received 74,314 Republican votes and 10,267 Democratic votes, Hughes received 31,229 Republican votes and 8,395 Democratic votes, and Harding received 24,606 Republican votes and 2,849 Democratic votes. With Wood getting 169,010 and Johnson 120,955 Republican votes, Wood has a lead of 38,055 in Republican votes. With 39,206 Democratic votes for Johnson and 17,336 for Wood, Johnson has a lead of 21,870 over Wood in Democratic votes.



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
