

Practical Urges 38 Millions for New Schools

Board of Education Head, in Letter to Mayor, Points Out Necessity for Appropriations for Next Year

111,000 Seats Needed

Questions Advisability of Erecting New Buildings in Congested Districts

Annin S. Prall, President of the Board of Education, made public yesterday a letter, addressed to Mayor Hylan, urging upon the city administration the necessity of appropriating \$38,000,000 for school housing relief in 1921 and the erection of a new headquarters building for the Department of Education. The letter says that 111,000 additional seats will be needed to give every child class accommodation.

President Prall questions the advisability of erecting school buildings in the thickly congested portions of the city, saying: "If we continue to build schools in the thickly congested portions of the city the people will not move out to those neighborhoods where their children may have proper surroundings and into which the subways have been built for the purpose of relieving congestion."

Urges Need for Buildings

"The Department of Education will soon present to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for its consideration the budget request for the year 1921, and included therein will be an item for sites and buildings.

Urges Need for Buildings

"The urgent need of additional sites and new school buildings is of such importance that I deem it advisable, before submitting our request to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to present to you the facts regarding school housing conditions in this city.

Many Congested Places

"Most of the congested places included in our list are in the Bronx, Manhattan, Richmond, Westchester, Dutchess, Sullivan, Ulster and Albany counties.

Increased Tax Small

"The tax rate for the city at large for the year varies from \$2.48 a \$100 valuation in Manhattan to \$1.10 a \$100 valuation in the Bronx and Richmond.

Prall's Proposed Program

Prall's proposed program for the year 1921, all of this work will be well under way during the year.
