

N. J. Democrats Vote Down Wet Plank, 37-35

Women Solidly Behind Dry Cause, Defeat Nugent's Resolution at the State Convention in Trenton

Party Split Predicted

Perfect Harmony Rules at Republican Meeting and Law Enforcement Urged

Special Dispatch to The Tribune. TRENTON, N. J., Oct. 5.—Strife broke loose in the State Democratic Convention this afternoon after a clash between the wet and the dry elements of the party, and the session closed in a turmoil, with virtually all of the members on their feet and shouting to be heard. Difficulties had been anticipated, but they developed far greater proportions than had been feared and, in consequence, a rift has been made in party harmony that is considered almost impossible to close in sufficient time to make possible any sort of effective campaign in the state.

All Women Are Dry

After the report of the majority of the resolution committee, which made no mention of the prohibition question, Nugent submitted a minority report favoring a revision of the Volstead act as a permit to sale of wines and beer. In support of the adoption of this report, he made a vigorous speech in which he denounced prohibition as a violation of the personal liberties of men, which Americans since the days of the Revolution have fought to sustain.
