

# Red Spirits Firing in Sky Alarm Italians

## Mysterious Shooting and Explosions in Air Together With Showers of Stones Terrorize Perugia

### Pandemonium at Night Peasants Identify the Mischief-makers as Anarchists Escaping From Hades

MILAN, Nov. 13.—Many newspapers recently printed a thrilling story of extraordinary things happening in the neighborhood of Perugia. The story was of "shooting spirits," described as "evil spirits," evidently come from the other world. Anarchists had thrown bombs in Milan and were being arrested, but at Perugia they evidently floated through the sky at night, threw explosives from the clouds and vanishing in the air as soon as the carabinieri appeared.

How the story originated is still in doubt. According to the best account, the priest of a country church at Monteleone, about two miles from Perugia, started to ring the Angelus one evening. Immediately there was a shower of stones from the sky. All the windows of the church were smashed, and the priest was frightened, the inhabitants were terrified and although the police called nobody was found in the neighborhood.

### Mystery Unsolved

The same horrible demonstrations were experienced on successive nights, when no attempt was made to ring the bells. The "invisible" mischief-makers were heard walking on the roofs and producing pandemonium in the air. The police remained in observation several nights when the same demonstrations were repeated and finally withdrew without being able to solve the mystery.

### Wine Tax Protested

Within the last three years the government has so extended and increased the wine and wine excise taxation that it is impossible to go to one's cellar all alone and empty a glass of Chianti without inviting friends. The cost even today of producing a glass of wine at Frascati or Chianti is only about one lira a liter, and what with the taxes and super-taxes it now reaches four lire. This, if nothing else, is enough to produce a semi-revolution in Italy for a real revolution need never be feared.

### Lord Grey's Sight Impaired

### Unable to See Birds and Flowers, He Says

LONDON, Oct. 25.—Viscount Grey's eyesight is so impaired that he is "unable to see birds and flowers," according to a letter which he has written to the Berwickshire Naturalists' Club, declining an invitation to participate in one of two field meetings. He says that although he could see sufficiently well to walk, he was unable to see birds or flowers or even a view, and would, therefore, be unable to share the interests of the expedition.

### Propaganda Launched Among Moslem Women

### Congress of Eastern Peoples Seeks to Enlist Mahometans in Struggle for Liberation

LONDON, Oct. 28.—The Congress of Eastern Peoples, which was held at Baku in September, decided to undertake a campaign of education and propaganda among the Mohammedan women of the East, says a wireless-dispatch from Moscow quoting the Russian newspaper, Pravda. Women delegates to that congress are declared to have urged a convention of another congress to be composed exclusively of women of the East. Soviet Russia would be represented in such a congress by delegates from Astrakhan, Turkistan, Dakhistan and Azerbaijan. The purpose of the proposed campaign as defined by the newspaper would be to induce Eastern women to "take their places in the ranks of the strugglers for the liberation of the East."

His faith in a wreck-finding device, the secret of which he keeps, is such that he anticipates the recovery even of the losses of ancient civilizations in the Mediterranean and the China Sea.
