In Chains of Circumstance Walpole's Novel of the Year Is Study of a Strong Central Personality

THREE dwelling houses stage the greater part of Hugh Walpole's novel of 1920, *The Captives* (Doran). The girl, Maggie Cardinal, journeys through them in the progress of the chapters, each is a distinct setting, as positively aside from the others as is an act between curtains of a play of diverse backgrounds.

The whole book is concerned with the bitter fight of the young girl to assert herself, to live in harmony with an ideal of life she has developed, which she keeps ever before her as a Grail at some day to be come up with and grasped. Nothing daunts Maggie. Her mind, scantly stored with furnishings from the treasury of books, the lipore of social usage and the minor essentials of what we term good education, is yet honest enough, strong enough, to hold its own when the artifice of life, the furniture about her, is crumbling away in disorder.

As in other novels from his pen, Walpole is meticulously careful in sketching in the trappings of environments. He is a lapidary when it comes to giving Maggie and her little company of companions settings that stand before the eye of the mind, yet, almost in the physical vision of the reader, vivid, complete to incline details. Follow these sentences and note the extreme flow of minutiae: "There was no sound in the room—then slowly things emerged: the long white bed first, afterward a shaded lamp beside it, a little table with bottles, a chair—beyond these shapes, near the window a high glass, a dark shade that was the dressing table, and faint gray squares where the windows hung."

We mentioned three houses. Each is dominated by a religious atmosphere, if one may so speak of "atmosphere." It is the prisoning power of the three, the grip of the emotional and the traditional in each, that holds the girl and her lover, Martin Warlock. Walpole, speaks of the dual personality present in some of his people in this book, but there is none of it in Maggie Cardinal. She is a child of the obvious, touched at times and captured
