



### U. S. Flyer to Try California-Florida Trip in Two Hops

Most Ambitious Event Ever Attempted by Army Service Starts Monday; 2,079 Miles in 21 Hrs., Schedule

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19.—The most ambitious aeronautical event ever staged by the Army Air Service—a transcontinental flight of 2,079 miles from San Diego, Calif., to Jacksonville, Fla., in twenty-four hours—will be attempted by Second Lieutenant William D. Coney, of the 91st Aero Squadron, beginning at sundown, Monday, the War Department announced today.

Lieutenant Coney will attempt to make the California-Florida flight in two hops, his schedule calling for completion of the first hop, from San Diego to Houston, Tex., a distance of 1,575 miles, in eleven and a half hours, and from Houston to Jacksonville, a distance of 804 miles, in nine and a half hours.

The flight will be made in a specially equipped airplane, with the front seat removed to make space for spare gasoline and oil tanks, capable of carrying 500 gallons of gas. The plane is equipped with copper-tipped Eagle propellers and two sets of B. G. plugs.

Maps of the air route to be covered have been made, the Weather Bureau is to cooperate in furnishing reports of the upper air, and time checkers have been assigned for each stop.

"The earth's circumference at the 30th parallel is approximately 18,211 miles," Major General C. T. Menner, director of the Army Air Service said today, "Should the flight of 2,079 miles be accomplished in a day, then it may be estimated by way of speculation that at the same rate, the circumnavigation of the globe could be made around the 30th parallel in nine days and two hours. Lieutenant Coney's effort to cover 1,275 miles in a non-stop night flight is without precedent."

For purposes of comparison, the air service gave out the following information of previous attempts of aviators to make record flights:

"The non-stop flight of 1,200 miles made on June 27, 1920 by the All-Metal 5-B in a flight from Omaha, Neb., to Pine Valley, N. D., pilot, Bert Acosta; passenger, John M. Larson; mechanic, W. Bugh; the unsuccessful but dashing exploit of Harry Hawker and Commander K. Mackenzie Grieve in their trans-Atlantic attempt in a Sopwith with Rolls-Royce engine; Lieutenant Charles R. Austin's thrilling experience of ten hours and twenty-five minutes of sustained flying over the Caribbean Sea in a remodeled DH 4 B, covering 1,000 miles, battling wind and storm which broke down his propeller, though not his courage, and forced him to turn back and abandon his attempt to fly from France Field, Canal Zone, to Washington, D. C., a distance of 2,435 miles, 1,850 of which was overseas in hop of 650, 400 and 280 miles each; and the brilliant performance of Sir John Alcock and Sir Arthur Whitten Brown, whose achievement in covering 1,980 nautical miles in fifteen hours in a Vickers-Vimy in a coast to coast flight are still in a class by themselves."

### Reds Reported Offering Oil Concession to Dutch

Would Permit Exportation of Petroleum on Condition That Industry Is Rebuilt

THE HAGUE, Feb. 18.—Reports in Soviet newspapers that the Moscow government has offered oil concessions in Baku, Caucasus, to the Royal Dutch Oil Company have aroused much interest in Dutch financial circles. Jan Heer de Jonge, one of the executive directors of the company, said today he could neither affirm nor deny the reports, but that if they were true the matter would be handled through London, where President Detering now is.

### U. S. Produced 69 Per Cent Of World's 1919 Oil Supply

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.—Sixty-nine per cent of the world's petroleum production in 1919 came from the United States, a compilation made public today by the geological survey disclosed. The world total was placed at 541,845,000 barrels, of which the American output was 377,719,000 on preliminary figures; Mexico with 87,073,000 barrels, or 16 per cent, standing next, and only one other country, Russia, reaching 5 per cent. Of the grand total, 98 per cent came from the United States, Mexico, Russia, Dutch East Indies, India, Rumania, Persia and Galicia.
