

Supreme Council May Change Parts Of Sevres Treaty

Committee Will Submit
Proposals to Modify
Kurdish and Armenian
Clauses; Turks Are Heard

LONDON, Feb. 26.—While the Near Eastern conference has made no real progress toward reconciling the Turkish and Greek viewpoints on Smyrna and Thrace, a special committee of the Supreme Council to-day decided to submit formal proposals to the Supreme Council regarding possible modification of the Kurdish and Armenian clauses of the Treaty of Sevres, in the light of recent events. Both Turks and Armenians were heard by the committee on

the subject of Turkish Armenia and Kurdistan. The Armenians asked for recognition of their full independence. When the Turks met the committee in the afternoon Earl Curzon, the British Foreign Secretary, explained that the powers had not the slightest intention of abandoning their obligation to constitute a united and stable Armenia. He emphasized the need of a frontier acceptable to all parties and providing a secure national existence for Armenia. M. Berthelot, in behalf of the French delegation, reaffirmed the intention of the French, when withdrawing from the military occupation of Cilicia, to make provisions safeguarding the interests of the Armenians there. Greek delegates to-day still were awaiting a reply from Athens regarding the Allied proposal that a commission gather information relative to Greek and Turkish claims in Smyrna and Thrace. Belief was expressed here that inducements, such as recognition of King Constantine and financial assistance, had been offered them. The proposal of the Turkish Nationalists to negotiate separately with France has not yet been answered by the Paris government.




