On Pacific Coast Shows Gain

San Francisco and Atlanta Reserve Bank Reports Indicate an Improvement in Fruit Movements

Slow but steady improvement in two widely separated portions of the country as the Pacific Coast section and the Southeastern section is shown in the monthly reports on business conditions issued by the Federal Reserve agents for the Twelfth and Sixteenth districts.

Fire in Exchange
Holds Up Trading
For Three Hours

20 Patrolmen Called Out to Maintain Order Among the Crowds; Damage is Estimated at \$12,000

Fire starting at the north wing of the Stock Exchange shortly after 9 o'clock yesterday morning spread to such an extent that trading in securities had to be postponed from the usual 10 o'clock opening until 1 o'clock. The chief damage to the interior of the building was done to the annunciator board, on the north wall, used to put the brokers in touch with their offices by numbers which are flashed in white on a black background. Unofficial estimates placed the loss at \$12,000 to \$15,000.

Firemen appeared at the scene of the blaze a few minutes after the alarm had been sent in, while twenty patrolmen of the Old Slip Station were called out to maintain order among the crowds which gathered on Wall Street. Inside the exchange the brokers assembled at the south end and watched the flames trickle through the annunciator board until the dense smoke forced them to seek the open air. Steady streams of water were directed at the board until the flooring underneath the annunciator board was charred.
