Rolling Stock Threatened

The complaint further states that certain creditors are pressing for payment, that suits are threatened, that sections may be levied on equipment and property of the defendant, and that there is grave danger the defendant may thereby be deprived of the use of its equipment and rolling stock. It is alleged also that, for the benefit of the public and for the creditors, it is desirable that the operation of the subway and elevated lines be kept intact.

LONDON BELIEVES GRAVITY OF DECISION WILL COMPEL DE VALERA TO SHARE RESPONSIBILITY WITH THE PEOPLE

Truce Situation Popular Sinn Fein Leader's Reply to Lloyd George's Note May Be Made To-morrow

From The Tribune's London Bureau. LONDON, Aug. 27.—The outcome of the Dail Eireann's secret consideration today of Premier Lloyd George's letter of warning to Sinn Fein to come to terms is expected to be a decision to put the issue up to the Irish people. The grave responsibility resting on the shoulders of Eamon de Valera, republican spokesman, it is believed, will force him to submit to a general vote on the question whether Ireland shall hold on to its independence.

Planned Renewal of Fight

Fully exonerated by the courts of the charges of fraud hurled at him by Hefferich, Erzberger planned to resume his fight against the forces of the Weimar Republic and to be responsible for Germany's downfall. His strength had been greatly missed by the Weimar government in its struggle with the inadequate Reichstag majority.

De Valera Curbed by Sentiment

It is felt De Valera cannot afford to make any move against peace, because it would not only force new difficulties on his own land, but also a weary of disorder and so concerned in the present reign of peace, but it would also make him unpopular with a large element of the people of Ireland and jeopardize his hold on the Dail.

Outlook Counsels Delay

Indicative of the feeling here, "The Outlook" says: "We admit that the 'wait and see' policy in Ireland has in the past led to bitter strife, but today it is not war, but peace, that is in the air. A policy of irreconcilability in London, by its very nature, is a determination by any of the interested parties to insist upon a definite 'Yes' or 'No' to take up rhetorical challenges and force a hard and fast decision would this moment national developments are now being carried up."

Charges "Hefferich Is Murderer"

"Die Freiheit" writes: "Hefferich is the murderer!" cried President Loeb of the Reichstag, addressing a gathering of cabinet members and party leaders at the Chancellery palace, yesterday. "I lack words to express the full character of this crime, the political and moral enormity of it, but I do not doubt, nor can I free myself from the conviction, that Hefferich is a murderer."

Lloyd George Sees Irish in Civil War if British Yield

DeValera Program Would Invite Most Cruel and Bitter Conflict Island Ever Has Had, He Says

Declares His Hope In Common Sense

Time to Lay Prejudices Aside, He Pleads; Reiterates Stand Empire Must Remain a Unit

BARNESLEY, England, Aug. 27. (By The Associated Press).—The separation of Ireland from the United Kingdom would bring on the most cruel and bitter civil war that island has ever seen, Premier Lloyd George said today in an address here. Such a war, he added, would affect the peoples of the British Empire throughout the world. It would draw aid to both sides in the battle from all parts of the world. England could not witness such a struggle at her doors, he asserted, nor could Great Britain countenance the tearing up of the kingdom.

Scotland and Wales Cited

"If Scotland and Wales are not satisfied with freedom then I fear all hope of accommodation must be abandoned. We only want to do what is fair, right and just. If Ireland has a right to separate, then Scotland and Wales have a right, but no Welsh or Scotch patriot would ever dream of demanding separation."

Devalues Political Vendetta

"Whether it is in public or in private trust, no man can endure who has a vendetta in business or politics, and a nation's vendetta are just the same. It is a sour pasturage of hatred, that is not only a curse to the nation, but also a curse to the individual. For God's sake let us clear aside prejudices. A nation that lives on prejudices is doomed, just like a man who lives on hate."

Devalues Political Vendetta

"If you had severance it would lead in Ireland itself to the most cruel and most terrible civil war Ireland has ever seen, and help would be rushed from all sides and every part of the world to assist in the fight. We were fighting on the battle. We could not witness civil war of that kind at our own doors which would involve our own people in the same strife, and other peoples as well."
