### Bronx County Convention To-night in Morris High School to Act on Legislation Vital to Veterans

### Jamestown Is Preparing to Entertain State Delegates: Lafayette Day Exercises in Washington Sq. Tuesday

A full account of the action of the Court of Appeals on the state bonus for veterans will be found elsewhere in this newspaper.

Legionnaires of Bronx County will hold their annual convention this evening in the auditorium of Morris High School and indications are that it will be the most successful the organization has had in that borough.

State Vice-Commander William F. DeGua, who is the chairman for Bronx County, will preside, with Dan Skilling as secretary.

The Legionnaires of the Bronx have a reputation for constructive efforts on behalf of the veterans of the World War and they are expected to act on several resolutions to-night which will have a vital bearing on soldier legislation.

The delegates to the county convention will choose eleven of their number to represent the Bronx at Jamestown, and it is likely that the county officers will be numbered among them.

Monday's convention will begin at 8 o'clock promptly.

### Naval Reserves Home To-day

Six hundred naval reserves will arrive in the North River to-day after their annual summer cruise. All of them are from the 3d Naval District.

At 9 o'clock to-morrow morning the three squadrons will be reviewed by naval officers of high rank, who will be aboard the battleship, the fleet's flagship, with Captain I. W. Thimmon, U. S. N., who is in command of the reserve organization.

The review will be completed at two o'clock, after which the boats and their commanding officers, having visited the various drills and then dispersed, will be put to bed.

More than 2,000 reserves and members of the Naval Militia have been training since the summer, under the direction of Captain Timmon and Commander C. J. Anderson and their staffs. Other cruises are to be made before autumn.

### Lafayette Day Exercises

Members of the Legion in Manhattan will observe Lafayette day, next Tuesday, with memorial exercises at the Lafayette monument in Washington Square.

Prominent speakers are on the program, including state officials of the Legion. The exercises will begin at 10 o'clock.

### Prepared for Convention

Jamestown, N. Y., is preparing to entertain delegates to the annual state convention of the Legion. E. B. Briggs, commander of the Union Spring Post, of that city, has sent circulars to all post commanders in which are found full instructions for the delegates. The health of the delegates is being looked after.

## Train Jumps Track and Crashes Through Hotel

SPRINGFIELD, Mass., Aug. 30.—Property damage estimated at \$100,000 or more was done early to-day when a train of three loaded trolley express cars bound from Worcester to this city got beyond control on the incline of State Street, jumped the track at a switch at Dwight Street and crashed into the corner of a two-story brick and stone building, occupied principally by the Victoria Hotel. The head car tore away the supporting pillars at the corner of the block and burst itself in the interior, while a large section of the brick wall, extending to the roof, splashed down upon all three cars.

James J. Irwin, motorman, was carried into the building with the head car, but was unhurt. Abraham J. Berger, express messenger in one of the other cars, was buried in wreckage and not extricated for an hour. His injuries are serious. J. A. Simpson, of Gloucester, N. Y., a hotel guest, was severely cut but not seriously hurt. The fall of the wall left a large opening in the upper portion of the building, the lower portion of the structure being intact. The cars were guests at the hotel last night.

The third annual convention of the department of New York, American Legion, is to be held in Jamestown on Friday and Saturday, September 23 and 24. Local arrangements have been made for the delegates and the local committee will be in charge of the state exercises.




