Former Governor Informs Friends He Won't Tie Up With Combine Seeking to Elect Publisher Senator

Faces Tammany Break Rank and File Want Al to Head State Ticket, but Murphy May Pick Another

Former Governor Alfred E. Smith has had enough of working with Hearst and Hyland, and has made it clear to his friends that, so far as he is concerned, it is never again to be the stump for Hyland and materially assisted in rolling up the record-breaking plurality of 417,000 on Tuesday.

Tammany Favors Smith

The Tammany rank and file want Al to run for Governor next fall, using the same issues that were employed by Hyland in the municipal campaign.

Peace Depends on Hearst

Peace depends on what Hearst is disposed to collect for political services in the last campaign. He presented a bill for services to Tammany at the Buffalo state convention in 1906, and it was passed by the nomination for Governor, after what the late Governor Thomas F. Grady characterized as "the best day's work of my life."

Expect Murphy to Dominate

Murphy, the wise ones say, will dominate the next Democratic State Convention, and if Smith does not take the nomination for Governor, because of his contempt for Hearst, Murphy will name some one who will run on the Hearst platform.
