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Surgical Aid Is Fought By Self-Wounded Doctor

Far Rockaway Practitioner, Victim of Cancer, Fires a Bullet Into His Brain

With a bullet in his brain, Dr. Garrett W. K. Schenck, forty-two years old, of 2139 Mott Avenue, Far Rockaway, fought yesterday for several minutes with two policemen and a surgeon. He died of his wounds.
