Four hundred and ninety-four men and twenty-five women, five of the latter with young babies, were sheltered in the Municipal Lodging House last night—"the most distressful gathering ever seen in New York," according to Superintendent McMahon.

Severe cold of Wednesday night, when a temperature of 8 above zero and a northeast gale rendered hundreds of poverty-stricken homes uninhabitable, drove ill-clad and shivering folk to the lodging houses in steady procession that lasted nearly all night. Yesterday the number of unfortunates sheltered by the city last night was three times that of the same night one year ago.

Christmas Mail Gains 20 Per Cent Over 1920

WASHINGTON, Dec. 22.—A statement given out by the Postoffice Department to-day says that reports to the department from postmasters of leading cities and the superintendents of the various divisions of the railway mail service indicate that the volume of Christmas mail handled up to December 21 shows an approximate increase of about 20 per cent over last year. The department says only one or two offices have decreases, and this is slight, and a considerable number indicate about the same volume as last year.
