



U. S. FLYERS ESTABLISH WORLD'S RECORD. Eddie Stinson and Lloyd Bertaud, former army aviators (left) snapped after piloting the American-made JL-6 all-metal Larsen monoplane (above) to a new world's record for endurance and continuous flying at Mineola last week. The machine kept to the air for 26 hours and 20 minutes, circling over the bleak Long Island plains through gales, snowstorms and zero weather from nine o'clock one morning until eleven the next, eclipsing the former record, held by France, by two hours. The single-motored monoplane covered some 2,600 miles or sufficient distance to easily have carried it from New York to London.
